

2006 PACIFIC NORTHWEST HONEY BEE POLLINATION SURVEY

2006 is the 20th year that the PNW honey bee pollination survey has been conducted by the OSU Honey Bee Lab. 2006 is also the **last** year this survey will be conducted. The information gathered over the past 20 years has given us a much better understanding and appreciation of the value of honey bee pollination to our region's largest industry (agriculture). From the survey data we have learned many things including the historical trends of increasing pollination fees and usage patterns for the various commodities that utilize honey bees in managed pollination. The survey has provided the strongest and longest data base for pollination services for any region of the U.S. Numerous beekeepers have reported the usefulness of the survey for their individual beekeeping operations.

I invite and welcome your participation in this year's survey. As concerns any individual beekeeper, all information you provide will be held in confidence. In filling out the attached form you do not need to provide your name unless you wish to do so.

Results from the survey will be published in the *OSBA BeeLine*, the *WSBA Newsletter* and the *USDA Honey Market News*.

Please return the completed form as soon as possible, hopefully before **December 15, 2006**. Please note a change of address for the Honey Bee program at OSU.

In concluding a 20 year activity that I believe has yielded valuable information to the academic community and perhaps more importantly, to the practicing beekeeping community, I wish to sincerely thank all the beekeepers who have participated over the past two decades. Your efforts have improved the general state of beekeeping in the Pacific Northwest, a unique area that continues to be a "promised land" for beekeeping and agriculture at-large.
