To whom it may concern, this document contains the requirements, rules, and points for the WASBA large and small clubs of the year competition.

- A. The following section contains the requirements to compete for WASBA's large and small clubs of the year.
 - 1. Club requirements.
 - a. All clubs participating must be current members of WASBA.
 - Clubs will only receive points for events conducted after becoming a member of WASBA.
 - 2. Club size.
 - a. Applicants for the large club of the year must be current members of WASBA, having more than 75 members.
 - b. Applicants for the small club of the year must be current members of WASBA, not having more than 75 members.
- B. Below is a list of events and points a club can obtain for the large and small clubs of the year.
 - 1. Club Participation
 - a. 3 points for each club meeting (one meeting per month, maximum 36).
 - b. 2 points for each workshop (any club-related training, social time outside of the normal meeting time).
 - c. 5 points Clubs that offer their members mentors.
 - 2. Club community involvement (Approved and supported by the club)
 - a. 10 points Education booth at the annual Bee Fun and Knowledge fest.
 - b. 10 points for hosting a community pollinator awareness event.
 - c. 10 points per continual community event (i.e., Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, 4H, FFA, etc.).
 - d. 3 points for presentation at a school or youth event.
 - e. 2 points for presentation for an organization other than a bee club. (i.e., master gardeners, flower, fuchsia, farm, etc.)

- 3. County Fair participation (more than one club can receive points at the same fair)
 - a. 20 points 2 pts per member up to 20 points
 - b. 10 points If the club hosts a WASBA honey contest at their county fair (WASBA will provide the standards).
- 4. Clubs that trained and provided certification in the WASBA educational program.
 - a. 2 points for 20% of members trained.
 - b. 5 points for 50 % of members trained.
 - c. 8 points for 80% of members trained.
- 5. Club Apiary maintain a club apiary.
 - a. 10 points for maintaining a club apiary.
 - b. 5 points for letting another club train in your apiary.
- 6. Club participation at the annual conference based on numbers from the previous annual conference.
 - a. 2 points for 20% of members attending the conference.
 - b. 5 points for 50 % of members attending the conference.
 - c. 8 points for 80% or more of the members attending the conference.
- 7. Clubs that participate with WASBA in the Sustainability in Prisons Program.
 - a. Offer WASBA education courses.
 - b. Assist with the apiary.
- WASBA Cookbook Recipes containing honey. Do not submit recipes copied from commercially published sources. It is recommended that recipes be original or originate from family members.
 - a. 2 points for every receipt submitted by club members (include the club member's name so credit can be given if published).
 - b. No more than ten recipes per club for a maximum of 20 points.
- 9. WASBA Newsletter Article
 - a. 5 points for an article written about something the club is doing.
- C. The Washington State Beekeepers Association is happy to support this competition.
 - 1. The club of the year competition will go from September 1 of the previous year to August 31 of the current year.
 - Each club must email us at <u>contest@wasba.org</u> if they plan to participate in the contest.
 - 2. The winning clubs will receive the following:
 - a. WASBA's large club of the year will receive a plaque and a cash prize of \$750.00.

- b. WASBA's small club of the year will receive a plaque and a cash prize of \$500.00.
- c. The winning clubs will be announced at the annual conference.
