

Washington State Beekeepers Association (WASBA) promotes beekeeping around the state – networking with local clubs, partnering with 4-H, Hives to Heroes, Community Colleges and even the Department of Corrections in both Washington and Oregon.

In 2019 we re-started our annual conference, drawing over 300 people to Eastern Washington on a cold, snowy February. In 2020 we quickly adapted to the COVID-19 restrictions and hosted a virtual conference with over 200 attendees from the US and Canada! The 2021 conference was rescheduled and on October 1-2, 2022 WASBA hosted a successful “JamborBEE” Conference with in-person and virtual attendees at the WSU Honey Bee & Pollinator Research facility in Othello, Washington! With a few events under our belts, we moved the Conference to the west side of the state in 2023 and made it “in-person only” encouraging over 200 beekeepers to join us in Olympia for some incredible talks. After lots of great feedback, the 2024 Conference was in Lynnwood and was our greatest success yet with 220 attendees, a regional breakout, honey tasting contest, speakers panel and more! We look forward to hosting it once again in Lynnwood for 2025 - we hope you will join us!
